A MESSAGE FROM RABBI NEIL



The Shattered Paradigm

For a long time, it was believed that evolution is always an extremely slow, gradual process until a famous paper in 1972 challenged that model. It explained that while usually evolution is a long process, at other times evolution happens very quickly as a result of external circumstances.

I have always viewed the evolution of the Jewish community in

a similar way – over three thousand years, sometimes change has come about very gradually, and sometimes very quickly. Liturgy often changes gradually, adding a few words here and there, or even changing melodies to change how the piece of liturgy feels when it is sung. Occasionally, though, especially when tragedy strikes, we add entire extra prayers, or when we come to understand that our liturgy needs to adapt to the times, we change it.

Reform Judaism is paradigm-shattering Judaism. It continues the boldness of generations before us who adapted our faith, and honors those who were brave enough to fight the voices of stultification by embracing creativity and change. Even only in the ten years that I have been at TBS, we have sometimes had to be extremely creative, especially as we responded to the pandemic and as we continue to respond to the changing needs of Jews in Santa Fe and beyond.

The theme of my High Holy Day sermons this year is The Shattered Paradigm. Judaism has always developed and grown, sometimes gradually and sometimes suddenly (which is why I believe that

“Reform Judaism” should just be called “Judaism,”) but it's not just communities that need to shatter paradigms, but also individuals. Teshuvah, the process of repentance that we engage in during the High Holy Days, involves acknowledging who we once were, and then profoundly changing who we need to be for the future. Teshuvah is not a violent, abrupt act, but is instead only achieved through a lengthy and powerful process of reflection and change, known as teshuvah. Teshuvah says, “I was once this, and now I need to be this” just as a healthy community says, “We were once this, and now we need to be this.”

The High Holy Days are a time of shattering paradigms – of honoring the past while looking ahead boldly to the future. By exploring Biblical and Rabbinic texts as well as the High Holy Day liturgy of personal and communal transformation, the sermons will

explore a number of differing paradigms that have been shattered in recent years, and how we might respond to them personally and communally. I hope that you might join me to hear them and share your thoughts with me afterwards.

Wishing you a paradigm-shattering year of health and happiness.

TBS CIRCULATING LIBRARY

The TBS Religious and Reference Library has been moved from the Upper Sanctuary to the north wall of the Social Hall, where all congregants using the Social Hall can consult our valuable collection. These books are available during Torah Study and other classes and can be taken down and studied at the Social Hall tables any time. Organization by the Reference Librarian Dana Densmore continues as the subcollections are categorized and labeled. As the photos show, this collection creates a beautiful and meaningful feature for the Social Hall, enhancing it as a Jewish space.

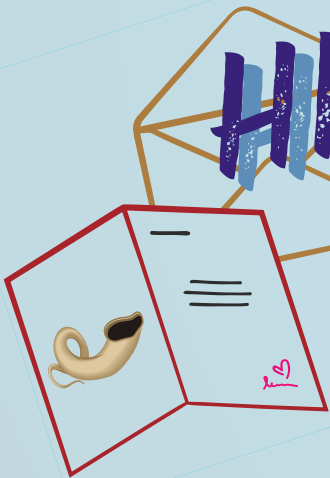
This reference library is in addition to our Circulating Library in the library space off the lobby of the Main Sanctuary. The main activity here (in addition to managing our self-checkout program for books in this collection) is our major project of cataloging all the books for our on-line catalog, which will go live when we have most or all of the books entered. Currently we have produced entries for 507 books. It will be searchable by title, author, topics, and other criteria that we have entered for each book. You will even be able to scroll through the collection looking at covers!
